1. Search box: Full Text Finder offers a responsive auto-complete for known title searching in your library's holdings.

2. Breadbox: Quickly view your current search selections and update your search results by removing selected items.

3. Browse by Discipline: Refine searches using subject-like disciplines, increasing the power of the Full Text Finder search.

4. Limiters: Refine a search without navigating away from the results page.

5. Facets: Filter search results by subject, resource type, publisher and more.

6. Keep search limiters: When this checkbox is enabled, you can create another search using the same settings by entering new search terms and clicking Search.

7. Search within Publication: Enter terms and locate full text articles from that publication. Automatically enabled for EDS integrations only.

8. Full Text Access: Expand Full Text Access to view all of the resources from which you can view full text articles for a result list item.

9. Sort Results: Defaulting to relevance, results can also be sorted by title.
